A lot was accomplished in 2024! TCAG hosted a successful valley-wide policy conference. With the theme, "All Paths Lead to Yes!" TCAG took inspiration to carry this vision into 2024. One of our great partnerships is the 99 Coalition with Madera and Merced Counties. As the 99 Coalition led the way, Caltrans Central Valley District 6 partnered with TCAG and our member agencies to obtain grants to fully fund the Highway 99 segment from Delano to Pixley as well as a \$98 million grant for the City of Tulare section.

Wait there's more! TCAG partnered with member agencies to receive significant funding for Active Transportation Program (ATP) projects and Cross Valley Rail. Roundabouts are being planned and constructed throughout the county. Transportation projects funded through TCAG are being used for economic development. Thank you to all of our partners for making 2024 so successful.

It started with TCAG being awarded \$98 million dollars from the Federal Infrastructure for Rebuilding America (INFRA) grant program to be used in various Highway 99 projects in the City of Tulare, including widening to six lanes between Prosperity Avenue and Road 200, and the rebuilding of the Paige Avenue Interchange. These improvements are significant and will serve to greatly enhance highway safety, traffic flow, bike and pedestrian access across the highway and open up new economic development opportunities. Other funding leveraged to obtain this grant include \$11.3 million from Measure R and an application for \$62.7 million from the State's Trade Corridor Enhancement Program (TCEP).

Shortly thereafter, TCAG was awarded \$58 million for the implementation efforts of the Cross Valley Corridor Express, a bus rapid transit system connecting various cities within the region to our neighbors in Kings County. The system is centered around providing express bus service with the current phase running between Lindsay in the east and Hanford in the west. Future expansion of the system will go all the way to Porterville in the east and Huron in Fresno County to the West. Tulare, Dinuba and Woodlake will be included in the system with bus services from their respective transit centers. The project is complemented with current transit facilities being proposed and constructed, including new transit centers in small communities, high density housing projects within close proximity to those centers, and active transportation connections. Ultimately, this effort will build ridership to support running a passenger rail system along the existing freight lines between these cities and connect to the future High Speed Rail Station in Hanford.







Lastly, the region's agencies have been awarded \$19.5 million dollars in competitive funding from the state's Active Transportation Program, which represents 20% of all of the funding awarded in this program in the entire state. This is a significant accomplishment and will fund three projects throughout the City of Visalia. These projects will provide bike and pedestrian access to major destinations, facilitate students getting to and from school safely and provide alternate modes of travel for the citizens. When looked at holistically, these improvements complement the other transportation efforts to improve access to our communities and have multiple options for how to get there.



# **Active Transportation**

Active Transportation continues to be an area of interest for local agencies and residents in Tulare County. Since its inception in 2013, the Active Transportation Program (ATP) has provided approximately \$68 million to local agencies in the County. For the most recent ATP funding cycle, TCAG staff held a number of workshops and training events for local agency staff to assist with the preparation of ATP grant applications for Cycle 7. In addition, ATP program managers and staff from the California Transportation Commission (CTC) conducted a 2-day in-person site visit to Tulare County to visit ATP projects and meet with staff.

#### **ATP Funding Success**

These visits provide the opportunity for agency staff to receive vital feedback and advice on how to prepare competitive grant applications. These efforts led to one of the most successful grant cycles for Tulare County agencies. Due to State budget uncertainties, the amount of ATP funding available for Cycle 7 Statewide and Small Urban and Rural component was reduced from \$341 million to \$101 million. Nevertheless, three projects from the Tulare County region were awarded funds totaling \$19.5 million or approximately 20% of the overall available funding. The projects awarded are:

- City of Visalia Highland Community
   Connectivity Project \$5,470,00
- City of Visalia Beyond Bike Lanes Elevating Santa Fe Street \$11,390,000
- City of Visalia Goshen Visalia Corridor Connection Project - \$2,636,000

Looking forward, TCAG staff will continue to work with our local agency partners, Caltrans District 6 and the CTC to ensure continued success in obtaining ATP funding for our region.



# FUNDING INNOVATION & EFFICIENCY



#### MEASURE R ACHIEVEMENTS

Measure R is a half-cent sales tax approved by the voters in 2006 and is frequently leveraged with federal and state grants. Since its inception, Measure R has been a resounding success and has led to the delivery of over \$2 billion dollars in construction projects that our region and its communities would not have been able to obtain otherwise. This is achieved through significant leveraging of Measure R funds. Throughout the region, the list of projects with Measure R is extensive and reflective of the desires of the people in this region by repairing crumbling roadways, improving safety, providing choices in how to travel, and opening up new infrastructure to support a growing economy. Measure R has been highly successful in meeting this mandate. During 2024, the following projects were funded with County Partners and Measure R:





In the coming years, a five-mile stretch from south of Avenue 200 to north of Prosperity Avenue in the City of Tulare will be widened and improved.





- SR99/Int'l Agri-Center Interchange in Tulare
- Riggin Ave 4-lane projects in Visalia
- SR245/Cajon Roundabout in Woodlake
- SR190/Westwood Roundabout in Porterville
- \$17.5 million across the county for local priorities

#### **FINISH THE 99**



In 2022, TCAG teamed up with our regional neighbors in Merced and Madera to form a collective advocacy group. These two regions share our situation of having portions of Highway 99 with only four lanes and are looking to complete the system by expanding the remaining segments to six lanes. By working together with these regions, TCAG is able to amplify its message and advocacy with our federal and state partners and ultimately get more funding for the completion of the highway. These unfinished segments represent a significant safety challenge and need to be completed to make our highways as safe as possible and continue to serve the goods movement needs of our growing regions.



#### **2024 Outreach Stats**

- TCAG has four certified car seat technicians on staff and counting.
- TCAG participated in six car seat safety events, partnered with Sit Right CPS, Tulare County Public Health, and other community agencies.
- A total of 137 car seats were checked:
  - 82 of those car seats were replaced with properly fitted and operational car seats.
  - The car seat misuse rate for these events in 2024 was 100%.
- At other outreach events, such as community events and health fairs, 750 children's multisport helmets were disseminated in 2024.


