SUMMARY MEETING MINUTES

1. Welcome & Introductions

Meeting opened by Ted Macaulay at 8:40a.m.

Persons in attendance introduced themselves.

2. Public Comments

This portion of the meeting is reserved for persons wishing to address the TCAG Active Transportation Advisory Committee on items within its purview but not on this agenda. Unscheduled comments are limited to 3 minutes. Note: Prior to the action by the Committee on any item on this agenda, the public may comment on that item.

Public comments opened/closed at 8:41a.m. No public comments were heard.

3. Action: Approval of Meeting Minutes for March 28, 2019

Member Pedro Ramirez moved to approve the minutes, and seconded by Member Minnick.

4. Information: 2020 Census Complete Count Outreach

Roberto Brady provided a brief overview of the Census grant, including the 'hard to count' specifications, and the fact that Tulare County had a large hard to count population. Mr. Brady mentioned that Barbara Pilegard was the project manager and that she would give an in-depth report at the next ATAC meeting. Discussion ensued regarding boundaries and census tracts with regard to Tulare County community plans.

5. Information: Multi-modal Outreach and Safety Program Update

Brideget Moore reviewed photos from three events: a Bike Safety workshop for parents, a Child Health and Safety event, and winners from a bike raffle. Ms. Moore presented survey information (gleaned from children and parents about walking and biking habits) and welcomed feedback. An update on outreach with the Visalia Rescue Mission and Jim Barnes was also provided, with the idea of having outreach in the Oval Park with actual biking practice and printing certificates for participation.

6. Information: Tulare County Public Health Bicycle and Pedestrian Fatality Update

Sharon Minnick discussed recent fatalities: there were three fatalities on Highway 99 in March, and one pedestrian fatality by train. It was proposed that ATAC think about Rail Safety in preparation for Rail Safety Month in September.

7. Information: Active Transportation Program (ATP) Update

Staff Gabriel Gutierrez gave the update that the California Transportation Commission (CTC) approved the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) component for safe routes to school projects in Ivanhoe and Woodlake; they were now programmed. CTC Staff would be visiting the week of July 29th.. Mr. Gutierrez reported that he would be working with the agencies to determine the schedule and how to improve applications.

Legislation to revamp the Active Transportation Program (ATP), funding distribution, and other changes were in progress and TCAG had not taken a position on it. Mr. Gutierrez reported that there would be an ATP symposium at Sacramento State University on August 19th and 20th, looking at bigger issues regarding the ATP. Mr. Gutierrez stated that he would send out additional information when it became available.

8. Caltrans District 6 Update

Pedro Ramirez informed that the bike plan for District 6 was almost done and would circulate to TCAG and ATAC for review within the next month. Mr. Ramirez reviewed Caltrans' bike month activities: Mall to Hall bike ride, bike to work day, silent ride in commemoration for those who have been killed while biking, prom ride, etc. Discussion ensued regarding setting up competition between schools for biking to school. Bike counts were also discussed.

9. Other Business

Mr. Brady discussed a safety workshop in Visalia that was Caltrans funded; Member Frank Senteno provided an overview of that workshop. There was to be a meeting the evening of May 23, 2019 to present findings to the stakeholders.

Ben Kimball discussed that being more creative would help in getting more money down the road. Mr. Kimball led a discussion on some funding sources that can be pursued, along with planning and implementation. All include Measure R and funds available to the ATP.

a. Active Transportation Planning

- Urban- HSIP, SB1- formula and competitive, HOUSING Coming, Caltrans planning grants, TCC
- ii. Rural- HSIP, SB1- formula and competitive, HOUSING- Coming, SALC, Caltrans planning grants, TCC

b. Implementation

- i. Urban- HSIP, CMAQ, SB1, Section 130, SHOPP, AHSC, HOUSING- Coming, TCC
- ii. Rural- HSIP, CMAQ, SB1, Section 130, SHOPP, AHSC, HOUSING- Coming, TCC

Some funding sources, such as (TCC) Transformative Climate Communities may be difficult to receive because they require connectivity to healthcare, schools, and/or downtown. Projects that receive TCC funding were wide-encompassing and did not, for example, only focus on providing bike lanes. While TCAG should be creative in looking for funding sources, TCAG must also be realistic in what they apply for and aim to accomplish.
