A. Action: Adoption of Resolution: Approval of Transfer of funds from City of Lindsay's Repayment of Regional Dollars in Measure R to Tulare County Regional Transit Agency

Ms. Davis explained the proposed transfer of funds from the city of Lindsay's repayment of regional dollars in Measure R to the Tulare County Regional Transit Agency.

Upon a motion by Member Crocker, and seconded by Member Link, the Tulare County Transportation Authority unanimously approved Item IV-A as presented. Absent Reynosa and Kimball.

B. Action: Adoption of Resolution: Approval of TCAG Director to Sign Measure R Maintenance and Security Supplemental Agreements

Ms. Davis explained maintenance and security supplemental agreements would need approval and the recommendation would be to designate the TCAG Director to sign these agreements.

Upon a motion by Member Valero, and seconded by Member Crocker, the Tulare County Transportation Authority unanimously approved the recommendations as presented in Item IV-

B. Absent Sayre and Mendoza.

C. Information: Measure R Revenue for August 2020 and Bond Update

Ms. Davis shared that the Measure R revenue for August was \$3,769,037.47 compared to \$2,710,093.56 for the same period the previous year. The year to date amount was \$7,181,490 compared to \$5,977,040 for the same period the previous year and represented a 20% increase. Ms. Davis explained that a reduction may be expected within the next couple of months.

Mr. Kuhn provided an update on the Bond and stated that some delay due to Covid-19 had occurred and recalled that the Bond had been approved by the Board back in March 2020 but that progress had begun.

D. Action: Adoption of Resolution: Approval of Update to Measure R Sales Tax Data Access

Ms. Davis explained the need to designate and update the titles of some staff to facilitate communication with the sales tax consultant. Ms. Davis stated that by making the purposed changes designated staff would be able to examine transactions and use tax records appropriately within the scope of their work.

Upon a motion by Member Crocker, and seconded by Member Shuklian, the Tulare County Transportation Authority unanimously approved Item IV-D as presented. Absent Sayre, Townsend and Mendoza.

E. Action: Adoption of Resolution: Approval of Additional Measure R Regional Funding for City of Farmersville Widening of North Farmersville Boulevard

Ms. Davis outlined the proposed funding to the city of Farmersville for the widening of North Farmersville Boulevard and stated that funding would be added to the expenditure work plan in the mount of \$1,071,000 for the project.

Upon a motion by Member Crocker, and seconded by Member Valero, the Tulare County Transportation Authority unanimously approved the additional Measure R Funds for the project as presented. Absent Townsend, Sayre and Mendoza.

I. CALL TO ORDER: The meeting convened as the Tulare County Transportation Authority Meeting and was called to order by Mr. Smalley at 2:08 p.m.

All action and informational documents were distributed for review and discussion. All actionable items would be voted on at the next Tulare County Transportation Authority (TCTA) Board meeting, scheduled for September 17, 2020.

III. AUTHORITY ACTION/DISCUSSION ITEMS

A. Action: Adoption of Resolution: Affirm Citizens' Oversight Committee Members Ms. Davis gave an update on member selection of Matt Ainley, Tulare County Home Builders Association, as Citizens' Oversight Committee representative.

IV. AUTHORITY ACTION/DISCUSSION ITEMS

A. Action: Adoption of Resolution: Approval of Transfer of funds from City of Lindsay's Repayment of Regional Dollars in Measure R to Tulare County Regional Transit Agency

Ms. Davis reported that this resolution was to approve the transfer of funds from the city of Lindsay repayment of \$463,500 to the Tulare County Regional Transit Agency for startup administration and implementation as needed and a new trust fund had been established to track expenses and revenues as it relates to TCRTA for auditing purposes.

B. Action: Adoption of Resolution: Approval of TCAG Director to Sign Measure R Maintenance and Security Supplemental Agreements Ms. Davis stated that amendment number 5 was passed to authorize the director to sign Measure R Maintenance and Security Supplemental Agreements, which all city managers received a copy.

C. Information: Measure R Revenues for August 2020 and Bond Update

Ms. Davis gave an update on the allocations; for August it was \$3,769,037.47 compared to \$2,710,093.56 for the same period the previous year. The 20/21 fiscal year to date amount was \$7,181,490 compared to \$5,977,040 for the same period the previous year,

representing a 20% increase for the fiscal year and represented the time period of July and August 2020. She mentioned she did not see as big as a reduction as expected and bond was expected to close on October 8.

D. Action: Adoption of Resolution: Approval of Update to Measure R Sales Tax Data Access

Ms. Davis shared the state recommendation to update the attached resolution to include appropriate staff to have access, designate, and to allow access to the newly appointed tax consultant.

E. Action: Adoption of Resolution: Approval of Additional Measure R Regional Funding for City of Farmersville Widening of North Farmersville Boulevard

Ms. Davis stated that to complete the project the city of Farmersville, funding was needed for the construction of this last phase. Although the scope of the project had not changed, the increasing costs over the years for construction now had an estimated cost of \$8,997,000. The city of Farmersville plans to take this Measure R supplemental agreement to the September 14th City Council Meeting for approval. The expenditure plan has an allocation of \$7,926,000 for construction and therefore, an additional \$1,071,000 needed to be added to the expenditure work plan to offset increased costs.

F. Action: Adoption of Resolution: Approving Addendum to Local Debt Policies Ms. Davis stated that the attachment 2 TCTA Debt Policy page 3 Section B needed to clarify the insertion of the debt policy, however after discussion with the team it was decided to move that insertion to item E Additional Bonds Test.

SUBJECT:

Action: Adoption of Resolution: Approving the 2020 Measure R Strategic Work Plan

BACKGROUND:

As outlined in the Expenditure Plan, a Bi-Annual Strategic Work Plan will be prepared. The Bi-Annual Work Plan outlines five-year expenditures for the Regional and Transit/Bike/Environmental Programs of Measure R. The timing of the preparation of the Strategic Work Plan is to coincide with the preparation of the Regional Transportation Improvement Program (RTIP).

DISCUSSION:

The Measure R Strategic Work Plan is the master plan for the delivery of Measure R projects in the upcoming five-year period. It details the revenue projections and possible financing tools needed to deliver Measure R projects. It takes into consideration the Measure R Expenditure Plan and the Measure R Policies and Procedures and combines them into one document that will produce Measure R projects in a timely and efficient manner. The Strategic Work Plan will be up-dated every two years. The update will evaluate the scope, cost, and schedule of all projects in the plan. Measure R funds will be distributed as follows:

- 1. Regional Projects
- 2. Local Programs
- 3. Transit/Bike/Environmental
- 4. Administration

Regional Programs (50%)

Table 1 provides a summary of proposed regional project expenditures for the next fiveyears beginning in FY 2020/21 and ending in FY 2024/25. Projects approved as part ofthe prior Strategic Work Plan serve as the base for the 2020 Strategic Work Plan.

1. Reaffirm funding for Regional Projects as shown on **Table 1** which is an attachment to the agenda (11x 17) consisting of 1 sheet.

As a conservative assumption, the annual revenue amount assumes a revenue growth of two percent. This assumption will provide funding for potential cost increases. The actual revenues will be monitored and a report will be provided monthly to the Authority Board.

Local Programs (35%)

The adopted Expenditure Plan provides the formula for Local Program distribution. Based on the Expenditure Plan and subject to the adopted Policies and Procedures, staff recommends that monthly distribution of local program revenues continue to all member agencies. The attached **Table 2** gives an estimated amount for local funding revenues in FY 2020/21 through FY 2024/2025.

Air Quality Program (14%)

The adopted Expenditure Plan includes route expansion for various agencies. Staff recommends the following:

- 1. Bike funding be provided as shown on the attached **Table 3**.
- 2. Environmental funds be used subject to the Measure R Expenditure Plan and Measure R Policies and Procedures limitation requirements.

Administration (1%)

The Measure R Expenditure Plan dedicates 1% of Measure R Revenues for administration and planning. The Authority shall expend only that amount of funds derived from the tax that is necessary and reasonable to carry out its responsibilities for auditing, administrative expenses, staff support and contract services. Note the administration is allocated within the TCAG budget and is not a part of the strategic work plan.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

Adopt the 2020 Strategic Work Plan.

- 1. Regional Programs Adopt per Table 1 (11 x 17; 1 sheets)
- 2. Local Programs Adopt per Table 2 (8 1/2 x 11; 1 sheet)
- 3. Transit/Bikes/Environmental Adopt per Table 3 (11 x 14 ; 1 sheet)
- 4. Administration Authorize expenditures as allowed by the Measure R Expenditure Plan
- 5. Authorize staff to make technical changes as necessary.
- 6. Reaffirm the Authority delegates authority to the Executive Director of the Tulare County Transportation Authority to sign Supplemental Agreements with member agencies.
- 7. Authorize staff to apply for grants to leverage Measure R Funds.

The Work Plan outlines five-year expenditures for the Regional and Transit/Bike/Environmental Program part of Measure R. The Plan coincides with the Measure R Expenditure Plan and the Measure R Policies and Procedures.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The 2020 Strategic Work Plan outlines the Measure R Regional and Bike/Transit/Environmental programs for the next five years starting in FY2020/2021 and ending in FY 2024/2025. The 2020 Strategic Work Plan coincides with the Measure

R Expenditure Plan and the Measure R Policies and Procedures. There is no fiscal impact above what had been approved in the Measure R Expenditure Plan.

WHEREAS, the adopted Measure R Expenditure Plan outlines that a Bi-Annual Strategic Work Plan will be prepared; and

WHEREAS, the 2020 Strategic Work Plan will serve as a master plan for the delivery of projects in the upcoming five year period from FY 2020/21 to 2024/25; and

WHEREAS, the seven sections below shall be approved as part of the 2020 Measure R Strategic Work Plan:

1. Regional Programs

Reaffirm funding for Regional Projects as shown on Table 1. As a conservative assumption, the annual revenue amount assumes a revenue growth of two percent. This assumption will provide funding for potential cost increases. The actual revenues will be monitored and a report will be provided monthly to the Authority Board.

- 2. Local Programs Reaffirm per the attached Table 2.
- 3. Transit/Bikes/Environmental Reaffirm per the attached Table 3.
- 4. Administration Authorize expenditures as allowed by the Measure R Expenditure Plan
- 5. Authorize staff to make technical changes as necessary
- Reaffirm the Authority delegates authority to the Executive Director of the Tulare County Transportation Authority to sign Supplemental Agreements with member agencies
- 7. Authorize staff to apply for grants to leverage Measure R funds; and

WHEREAS, TCAG staff is allowed to make technical changes to the 2020 Measure R Strategic Work Plan as necessary. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tulare County Transportation Authority approves the 2020 Measure R Strategic Work Plan (Tables 1-3) allow TCAG staff to make technical changes to the 2020 Measure R Strategic Work Plan as necessary, reaffirm authority to sign Supplemental Agreements and authorize staff to apply for grants to leverage Measure R Funds.

Information: Measure R Revenues for September 2020 and Final Bond Update

BACKGROUND:

On November 7, 2006, the voters of Tulare County approved Measure R, imposing a ½cent sales tax for transportation within the incorporated and unincorporated area of Tulare County through 2037. The transportation sales tax funds are spent in accordance with the Expenditure Plan that resulted from a joint effort among all the cities and the County of Tulare. The Expenditure Plan reflects the transportation needs of the residents of Tulare County. The plan includes funding for Regional Projects, Local Programs, Transit/Bike/Environmental Programs and Administration. The funds are distributed as follows:

- 1. Regional Projects (50%)
- 2. Local Programs (35%)
- 3. Transit/Bike/Environmental (14%)
- 4. Administration and Planning Program (1%)

Measure R revenue collection began on April 1, 2007. Monthly Measure R advancements are received by TCAG from the State Board of Equalization followed by quarterly clean-up disbursements. In total, TCAG receives eight advancements and four clean-up disbursements throughout a fiscal year.

The Measure R 2018 Strategic Work Plan was approved by the Authority on June 18, 2018 with Resolution No. 2018-102. The Work Plan serves as a guide for the delivery of Measure R projects in the upcoming five-year period. The 2018 Strategic Work Plan was amended on March 18, 2019 with Resolution No. 2019-104 and on April 15, 2019 with Resolution No. 2019-105.

DISCUSSION:

Status of Measure R Revenues

Fiscal Year 2019/2020 - Measure R allocations have been received, payment request and distribution made through September 2020. The allocation for the month of September is \$3,066,906 compared to \$2,786,760 for the same period last year. The 20/21 fiscal year to date amount is \$10,248,396 compared to \$8,763,800 for the same period last year, representing a 17 % increase for the fiscal year.

See attached revenue chart covering fiscal years 2016/2017, 2017/2018, 2018/2019, 2019/2020 and 2020/2021 year to date.

Our bonding efforts were successful and funding is expected October 8, 2020. A review of our expenditure work plan is complete and the outline for the next 5 years presented.
