SUBJECT:

Action: Adoption of Resolution: Approve the Measure R Funding for Litter Abatement Pilot (LAP) Program for the City of Porterville

BACKGROUND:

Highway litter is a growing societal concern that plagues the traveling public. A growing litter issue is indicative that current resources are not enough to keep up with the volume of litter being generated. Caltrans has experienced a dramatic increase in the volume of trash placed on the State Highway System (SHS) caused by variety of factors external to Caltrans operations.

Over the last couple years, Tulare County Association of Governments (TCAG), its Sustainable Corridors Committees (SCCs), Caltrans, and member agencies, have been examining methods that could increase litter removal along the region's highways. At the February, 2018 meeting, staff presented to the TCAG Board a conceptual framework for the region's Sustainable Corridors Program Litter Abatement Program (LAP), as a strategy that could help address the regions litter problem. The Board has authorized staff to coordinate with Caltrans and member agencies to develop LAPs that could ultimately be adopted and implemented.

DISCUSSION:

The City of Porterville is the first city that is moving forward with the LAP program. It will service two State highways (SR-190 and SR-65) within the city limits on a 30-day cycle. The cost is based upon one crew (7-9 people) to complete two cleaning cycles per month. The program is done in partnership with Caltrans District 6 and the TCAG/TCTA. Funding for this project comes from the City of Porterville and Measure "R". Caltrans has also committed to matching local funds on a one-for-one basis (over 3 years), essentially providing 50% of the necessary funding. Porterville's portion of the Measure R SR190 corridor improvement component provides another 25% of the funding, with the City providing directly the remaining 25%. No funding will come from the Measure R Sustainable Communities component for this effort. This new FY2021/22 program for the City of Porterville provides a total of \$162,000 in funding, with \$80,000 from Caltrans, \$42,000 from TCTA and \$40,000 from the City of Porterville. This three-year LAP is founded on the principle that litter is a "cross-jurisdictional problem," and therefore a variety of funding sources (state/regional/local) should be applied to address the situation.

To maximize the Caltrans match, the LAP program will be limited to state highways only. With that in mind, the two-year LAP program will look as follow:

WHEREAS, the FY2021/22 LAP for the City of Porterville provides a total of \$162,000 in funding, with \$80,000 from Caltrans, \$42,000 from TCTA Measure R SR190 corridor improvement funds and \$40,000 from the City of Porterville.

SUBJECT:

Action: Adoption of Resolution: Tulare County Transit Authority (TCTA) Fiscal Audit Consultant Selection

BACKGROUND:

On March 18, 2021, Tulare County Association of Governments (TCAG) staff sent out a Request for Proposal (RFP) to 50 firms for the preparation of the TCAG Fiscal Audits. The RFP identified \$45,000 as budgeted for the fiscal audit and \$6,000 for additional services as approved. Two (2) proposals were received. The proposals were from: Brown Armstrong CPA's of Bakersfield, and Price, Paige & Company, of Clovis.

DISCUSSION:

TCAG staff evaluated and scored the proposals based on the adopted scoring criteria including understanding of the work to be done, experience with similar kinds of work, quality of staff, capability of developing innovative or advanced techniques, local preference, and demonstration of Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) intent.

The audits will be performed for FY 2020/21, FY 2021/22 and FY 2022/23 and include Measure R audits for nine (9) member agencies as applicable. The firms showed understanding of the work to be done and have sufficient experience with similar audits. The firms had good references, qualified staff and were under budget. The firm that scored the highest based on the TCAG adopted procurement procedures is Brown Armstrong CPA's. This firm has the best understanding of how TCAG functions and has prior experiences with other Council of Governments (COG's) and Transportation Agencies. The results, based on the proposal scoring, along with the recommended budget is provided below:

RECOMMENDATIONS:

Based on the average scoring, Brown Armstrong CPA's is recommended by TCAG staff to conduct the fiscal audits for FY 2020/21, FY 2021/22 and FY 2022/23 at a cost not to exceed \$31,780 a year. Contract extension will be permitted on an annual basis for up to three years following, upon agreement by the TCAG Executive Director and Consultant. If needed, TCAG may also request additional services that fall within the scope of the contract that are not outlined within the Request for Proposal (RFP). Any additional services requested by TCAG will be paid up to an additional amount of \$6,000 per year with prior written approval of TCAG.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The audit budget was already approved in the FY 21/22 Overall Work Program (OWP). Funding is Measure R.

WHEREAS, on March 18, 2021, the Tulare County Association of Governments (TCAG) requested proposals for consultant services to prepare fiscal audits of the agency and selected funds under its jurisdiction for fiscal years 2020/21, FY 2021/22 and FY 2022/23; and

WHEREAS, two (2) qualified consulting firms submitted proposals to TCAG; and

WHEREAS, all proposals were evaluated and scored in accordance with the adopted scoring criteria as presented in the Request for Proposals (RFP); and

Action: Adoption of Resolution: Approve the Selection of a Financial Consultant for Measure R

BACKGROUND:

On November 23, 2009, the TCAG Board authorized and approved the amendment to the 2009/10 Overall Work Program (OWP) to allow for an increase to W.E. 700.01 (Measure R Implementation) for the hiring of a financial consultant to assist with the strategic planning of Measure R financing for both short term and long term. A Request for Proposals was released on March 18, 2021, and the deadline for the proposals to be submitted April 22, 2021; One (1) proposal was submitted.

DISCUSSION:

KNN Public Finance was the only firm to submit a proposal. This financial consultant provided information and recommendations to the Measure R Finance Committee and TCTA Board on important financing and/or bonding available to assist in project completion. KNN secured an "AA" rating with Standard & Poor, successfully procuring bond financing in July of 2014 and bond financing in October of 2020 to bring about cash flow for important construction projects within the next 5 years. KNN continues to meet deadlines and produce excellent products. Based on performance and product delivery it is recommended to continue business with KNN Public Finance

RECOMMENDATIONS:

Authorize the Director, to sign, on behalf of the Association, a contract with KNN Public Finance for Professional Financial Advisor Services based on past performance and product delivery at a cost not to exceed \$40,000 a year. Contract extension will be permitted on an annual basis for up to three years following, upon agreement by the TCAG Executive Director and Consultant. If needed, TCTA may also request additional services that fall within the scope of the contract that are not outlined within the Request for Proposal (RFP). Any additional services requested by TCTA will be paid up to an additional amount of \$10,000 per year with prior written approval of TCTA.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The FY 2021-22 OWP has a \$15,000 budget for the delivery of professional financial advisory services. The budget will be increased by \$25,000 to include dissemination agency and continuing disclosure consulting services as it pertains to the bonds.

SUBJECT:

Information: Measure R Revenues for April 2021

BACKGROUND:

On November 7, 2006, the voters of Tulare County approved Measure R, imposing a ½-cent sales tax for transportation within the incorporated and unincorporated area of Tulare County through 2037. The transportation sales tax funds are spent in accordance with the Expenditure Plan that resulted from a joint effort among all the cities and the County of Tulare. The Expenditure Plan reflects the transportation needs of the residents of Tulare County. The plan includes funding for Regional Projects, Local Programs, Transit/Bike/Environmental Programs and Administration. The funds are distributed as follows:

- 1. Regional Projects (50%)
- 2. Local Programs (35%)
- 3. Transit/Bike/Environmental (14%)
- 4. Administration and Planning Program (1%)

Measure R revenue collection began on April 1, 2007. Monthly Measure R advancements are received by TCAG from the State Board of Equalization followed by quarterly clean-up disbursements. In total, TCAG receives eight advancements and four clean-up disbursements throughout a fiscal year.

The Measure R 2020 Strategic Work Plan was approved by the Authority on October 19, 2020 with Resolution No. 2020-119, amended on December 14, 2020 with Resolution No. 2020-120, and amended on April 19, 2021 with Resolution No. 2021-100.

DISCUSSION:

Status of Measure R Revenues

Fiscal Year 2020/2021 - Measure R allocations have been received, payment request and distribution made through March 2021. The allocation for the month of April is \$3,446,800. compared to the \$2,303,672 for the same period last year. The 20/21 fiscal year to date amount is \$33,867,253 compared to \$29,136,969 for the same period last year, representing a 16% increase for the fiscal year.
