The Tulare County Transportation Authority was called to order by Chair Vander Poel at 1:58 p.m. on December 14, 2020 at the Tulare County Board of Supervisors, 2800 W. Burrel Avenue, Visalia, CA 93291.

Upon a motion by Member Valero, and seconded by Member Flores, the Tulare County Transportation Authority unanimously approved the Authority Consent Calendar Action Items III-A through III-C. Absent: Shuklian, Reynosa, and Link.

IV. AUTHORITY ACTION/DISCUSSION ITEMS

A. Action: Approve Sustainable Corridors Committees (SCCs) Strategic Priorities, Mighty 190 Corridor Priorities, and Authorization to Develop a Multi-year Funding Program

Ms. Poleszczuk presented the background and main duties of the SCCs; highlighted the corridors beatification goals, top priority projects, and project funding. Ms. Poleszczuk explained that approval of the SCC's strategic priorities, corridor 190 project priorities, and development of a multi-year funding program were being requested.

Upon a motion by Member Valero, and seconded by Member Townsend, the Tulare County Transportation Authority unanimously approved Item IV-A as presented. Absent: Shuklian, Reynosa, and Link.

B. Action: Adoption of Resolution: 2020 Measure R Strategic Work Plan Amendment No. 1 – Regional Funding Table

Ms. Davis described the proposed amendment to the 2020 Measure R Strategic Work Plan being requested by the city of Dinuba. Ms. Davis explained that the city of Dinuba would begin to design the right of way acquisition for the Alta/Kamm Roundabout which the proposed cost amounted to \$297,744; the city of Dinuba was requesting assistance to pay for the design in the amount of \$150,000.

Upon a motion by Member Valero, and seconded by Member Kimball, the Tulare County Transportation Authority unanimously approved amendment No. 1 to the 2020 Measure R Strategic Work Plan. Absent: Shuklian, Reynosa, and Link.

C. Action: Adoption of Resolution: SB 1 Local Partnership Program (LPP) Formulaic Program Project Nomination

Mr. Gutierrez stated that this was the third cycle of LPP funding made available by SB 1 and discussed the details regarding the programming of projects for the cycle. Mr. Gutierrez outlined the Avenue 280 widening projects located between Santa Fe and Lovers Lane in the city of Visalia and requested approval for the allocation of funds for the project.

Upon a motion by Member Boyer, and seconded by Member Townsend, the Tulare County Transportation Authority unanimously approved the LPP formulaic program project nomination as presented. Absent: Shuklian, Reynosa, and Link.

D. Information: Measure R Revenues for October and November 2020

Ms. Davis shared that the Measure R revenues for October were \$3,669,963 compared to \$3,259,423 for the same period the previous year. The year to date amount was \$13,918,359 compared to \$12,023,224 for the same period the previous year and represented a 16% increase. The allocation for the Month of November was \$3,463,430 compared to \$2,979,449 for the same period the previous year and the year to date amount was reported as \$17,381,789 and continued to look strong.

Ms. Davis stated that the item was the schedule for the next year for TCTA and TAC.

 A. Action: Approve Sustainable Corridors Committees (SSCs) Strategic Priorities, Mighty 190 Corridor Priorities, and Authorization to Develop a Multi-year Funding Program

Ms. Poleszczuk gave an update to the SCCs with an outline list of strategies, as a necessary first step, to enhance visual appeal of the state highways: 65, 99, 190 and 198 in Tulare County. At the TCAG Board meeting in July of 2020, the TCAG Board approved 2 million in funding for implementation of beautification strategies for corridor highways and with the help of Caltrans to select what areas of need.

- B. Action: Adoption of Resolution: 2020 Measure R Strategic Work Plan Amendment No. 1 Regional Funding Table
 - Ms. Davis stated that Amendment No. 1 to the 2020 Measure R Strategic Work Plan for the city of Dinuba would begin the design and ROW acquisition for the Alta/Kamm Roundabout and would need assistance in the amount of \$150,000.
- C. Action: Adoption of Resolution: SB 1 Local Partnership Program Formulaic Program Project Nomination

Mr. Gutierrez detailed that staff would be seeking the Authority approval to program SB1 Local Partnership formula funds on the city of Visalia Caldwell widening project.

SUBJECT:

Information: Measure R Revenues for November and December 2020

BACKGROUND:

On November 7, 2006, the voters of Tulare County approved Measure R, imposing a ½-cent sales tax for transportation within the incorporated and unincorporated area of Tulare County through 2037. The transportation sales tax funds are spent in accordance with the Expenditure Plan that resulted from a joint effort among all the cities and the County of Tulare. The Expenditure Plan reflects the transportation needs of the residents of Tulare County. The plan includes funding for Regional Projects, Local Programs, Transit/Bike/Environmental Programs and Administration. The funds are distributed as follows:

- 1. Regional Projects (50%)
- 2. Local Programs (35%)
- 3. Transit/Bike/Environmental (14%)
- 4. Administration and Planning Program (1%)

Measure R revenue collection began on April 1, 2007. Monthly Measure R advancements are received by TCAG from the State Board of Equalization followed by quarterly clean-up disbursements. In total, TCAG receives eight advancements and four clean-up disbursements throughout a fiscal year.

The Measure R 2020 Strategic Work Plan was approved by the Authority on October 19, 2020 with Resolution No. 2020-119 and amended on December 14, 2020 with Resolution No. 2020-120

DISCUSSION:

Status of Measure R Revenues

Fiscal Year 2020/2021 - Measure R allocations have been received, payment request and distribution made through December 2020. The allocation for the month of November is \$3,463,431 compared to \$2,979,449 for the same period last year. The allocation for the month of December is \$2,826,188 compared to the \$2,741,976 for the same period last year. The 20/21 fiscal year to date amount is \$20,207,977 compared to \$17,744,649 for the same period last year, representing a 14 % increase for the fiscal year.



SUBJECT:

Information: Conflict of Interest Code (Form 700) Due April 1, 2021

BACKGROUND:

The Tulare County Transportation Authority is required to adopt and maintain a conflict of interest code. This code outlines who must disclose information on an annual basis, and what type of information must be disclosed.

DISCUSSION:

The Political Reform Act requires certain officials and employees who serve in positions designated in an agency's conflict of interest code to file a Statement of Economic Interest (Form 700). Appendix A of this staff report provides a listing of positions that are designated to provide a Form 700 by April 1, 2021. Appendix B lists the disclosure categories for those designated positions. The Form 700 is available in an interactive version on the Fair Political Practices Commission website: www.fppc.ca.gov.

All interests in real property located entirely or partly within this Agency's jurisdiction or boundaries, or within two miles of this Agency's jurisdiction or boundaries or of any land owned or used by this Agency. Such interests include any leasehold, ownership interest or option to acquire such interest in real property.

All investments, business positions, and sources of income, including gifts, loans and travel payments.

(Intended for board members and high-level decision-making employees with broad duties)

2 Full Disclosure (excluding interests in real property):

All investments, business positions, and sources of income, including gifts, loans and travel payments.

3. Interests in Real Property (only):

All interests in real property located entirely or partly within this Agency's jurisdiction or boundaries, or within two miles of this Agency's jurisdiction or boundaries or of any land owned or used by this Agency. Such interests include any leasehold, ownership interest or option to acquire such interest in real property.

4. General Contracting (two options):

A. All investments, business positions, and sources of income, including gifts, loans and travel payments, from sources that provide, or have provided in the last two years, leased facilities, goods, supplies, materials, equipment, vehicles, machinery, services, or the like, including training or consulting services, of the type utilized by the County.

(Intended for employees whose duties and decisions invo/ve contracting and purchasing for the entire County)

B. All investments, business positions, and sources of income, including gifts, loans and travel payments, from sources that provide, or have provided in the last two years, leased facilities, goods, supplies, materials, equipment, vehicles, machinery, services, or the like, including training or consulting services, of the type utilized by the employee's department or agency.

(Intended for employees whbse duties and decisions involve contracting and purchasing for a specific department or agency of the County)

5. Regulatory, Permit or Licensing Duties:

All investments, business positions, and sources of income, including gifts, loans and travel payments, from sources that are subject to the regulatory, permit or licensing authority of, or have an application for a license or permit pending befare, the employee's department or agency, or the County.

6. Grant/Service Providers/Agencies that Oversee Programs (two options):

A. All investments, business positions, and sources of income, including gifts, loans and travel payments, or income from a nonprofit organization, if the source is of the type to receive grants or other monies from or through the specific department or agency of the County.

(Intended for employees whose duties and decisions involve awards of monies or grants to organizations or individua/s)

B. All investments, business positions, and sources of income, including gifts, loans and travel payments, or income from a nonprofit organization, if the source is of the type to offer or provide consulting, rehabilitative or educational services concerning the prevention, treatment or rehabilitation of persons.

(Intended for employees who a/so approves programs for rehabilitative services)
