



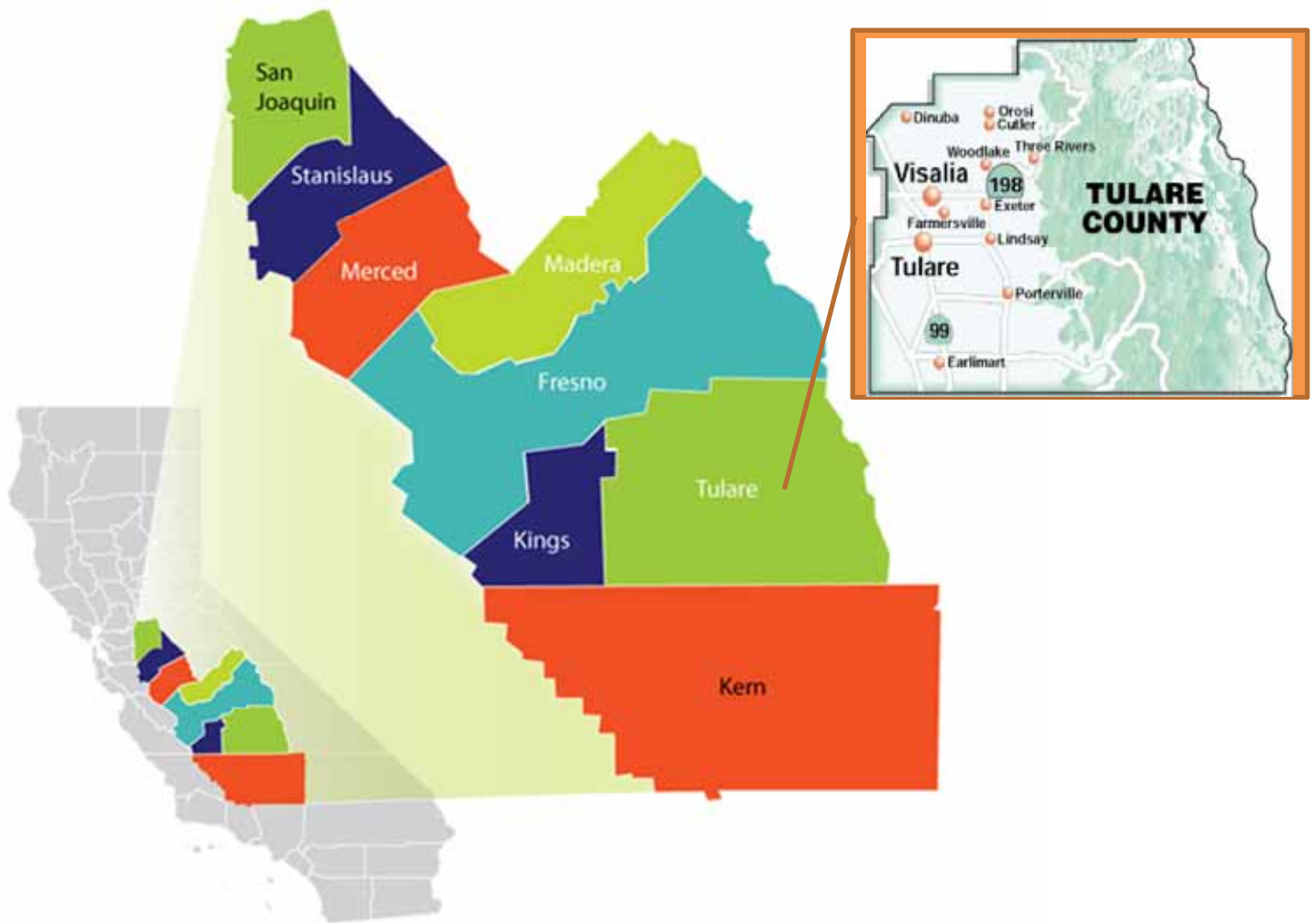

What is TCAG?

The Tulare County Association of Governments (TCAG) was formed by a joint powers agreement in 1971; that agreement was executed by the County of Tulare and the eight incorporated cities: Dinuba, Exeter, Farmersville, Lindsay, Porterville, Tulare, Visalia and Woodlake. The purpose of this formation was to:

- 1) Provide transportation planning on a regional level, responding to federal and state long-range planning requirements.
- 2) Assist local jurisdictions in obtaining federal assistance by providing advice, counsel and professional direction.
- 3) Review and coordinate applications for programs utilizing federal and state funding.
- 4) Provide a clearinghouse for the coordination and review of all projects funded through the state and federal governments.
- 5) Provide a forum for the coordination of governmental activities that involve long-range and functional planning for the incorporated and unincorporated areas of the county.
- 6) Provide area wide planning coordination in specific multi-jurisdictional areas, such as community development and housing, to avoid duplication and develop consistent goals.
- 7) Work with the Air District to promote the interests of the county regarding air quality proposals.

With the passage of Measure R, Tulare County became a self-help county. Members of TCAG sit as the Tulare County Transportation Authority who oversees the Measure R Citizens' Oversight Committee and the Measure R Finance Committee. Staff also supports the Tulare County Transportation Authority.

TCAG Board of Governors

TCAG is directed by a Board of Governors. This group is composed of one representative from each of the eight cities, the five members of the County Board of Supervisors, three members-at-large, and one transit representative. These seventeen members act as the Association of Governments, the Regional Transportation Planning Agency and the Metropolitan Planning Organization. These members, plus the District Director of Caltrans, sit as the Transportation Policy Advisory Committee.

This body offers advice on issues which will be presented to the Board of Governors. Each year the Board adopts an Overall Work Plan and Budget which sets the work activities for the next fiscal year. TCAG is partially supported by contributed dues from its member agencies. The major revenue source includes federal and state grants. Following is the current membership of the Board of Governors, as well as alternate members.

Tulare County Transportation Authority



Measure R is a half-cent transportation sales tax approved by voters of Tulare County in November 2006. This initiative is expected to generate over \$652 million in its 30 year lifespan.

The funds generated will be used as follows:

- 50 percent on regional projects. These projects are identified in the Measure R Expenditure Plan and were approved by all cities and the county.
- 35 percent on local projects, determined by each city and Tulare County.
- 14 percent on transit, bike and environmental projects.
- 1 percent on planning and administrative expenses.

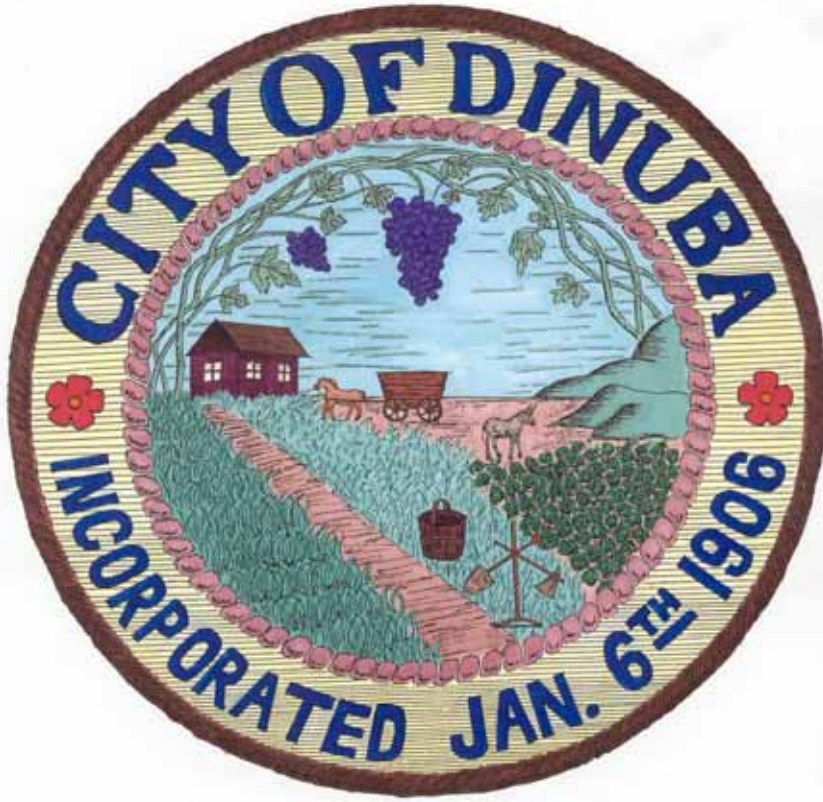

THE CITY OF PORTERVILLE

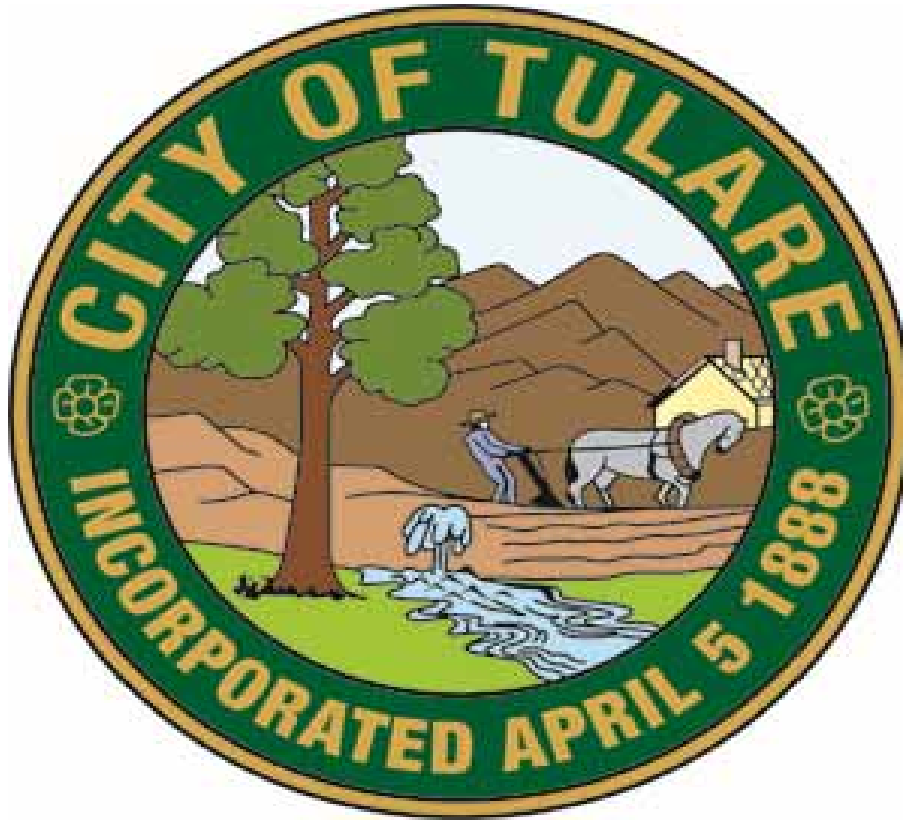

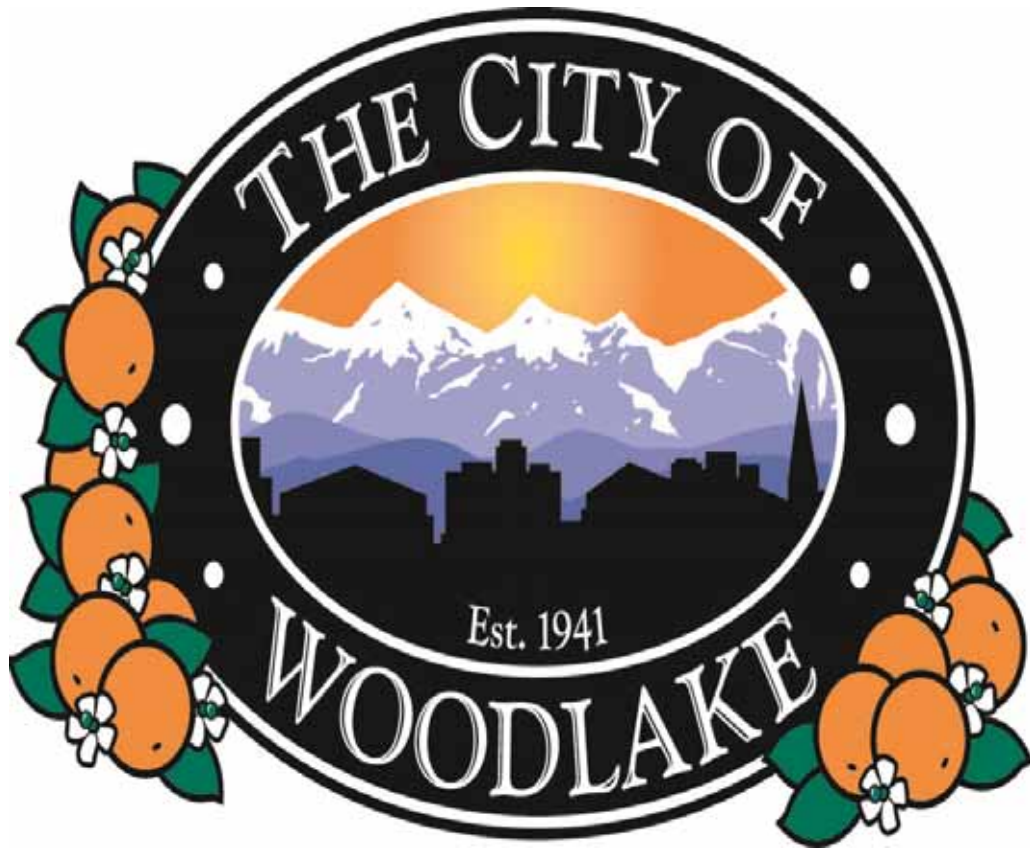

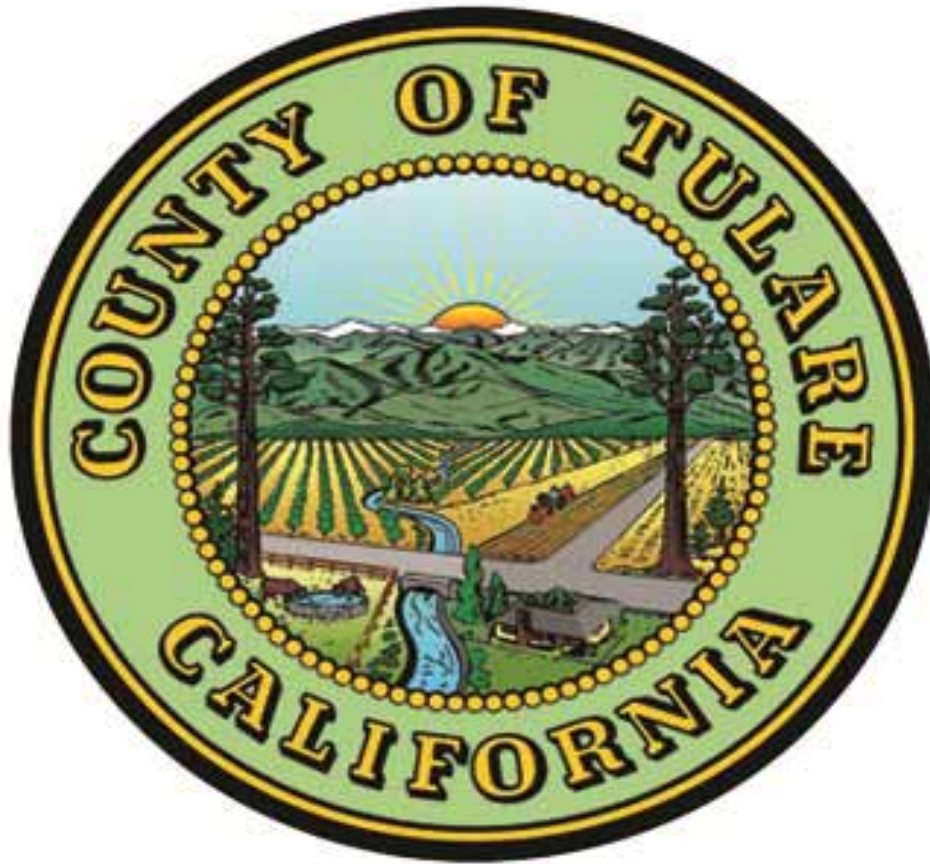
