TRIBAL OUTREACH

While the Tule River Indian Tribe is the only federally recognized tribe in Tulare County, both the Tule River Indian Tribe and the Santa Rosa Tachi Yokut Tribe received special notices of important meetings and invitations to participate. TCAG staff did present and discuss all three scenarios at a Tule River Tribal Council meeting. Those in attendance were encouraged to participate and submit a completed survey. All tribal council members present submitted a completed survey, along with tribal community members that were present. A formal AB 52 consultation was not requested by the local tribes.
